## THE FIVE LINES

# The five kupu of our pepeha

Each line names something that tells people who you are.

**Maunga**

*mountain*

the mountain you belong to

**Awa**

*river*

the river you belong to

**Waka**

*canoe*

the canoe your ancestors arrived on

**Iwi**

*tribe*

the people and tribe you belong to

**Ingoa**

*name*

your own name, said last with pride

# Five lines, in order

Each line starts with Ko and ends with your own word.

### 1. KO TŌKU MAUNGA



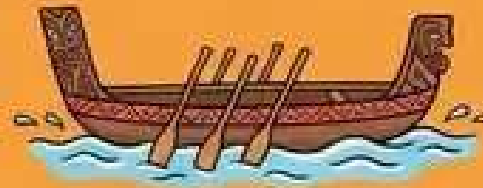
Ko [Maunga Name]  
tōku maunga.

### 2. KO TŌKU AWA



Ko [Awa Name] tōku awa.  
My River.

### 3. KO TŌKU WAKA



My Canoe  
Ko [Waka Name] tōku waka.  
My Canoe.

### 4. KO TŌKU IWI



Ko [Iwi Name]  
tōku iwi.

### 5. KO TŌKU INGOA



Ko [Your Name]  
tōku ingoa.
